

WASHINGTON & THE STATE OF COMPOSTING



HB 1799- ORGANICS MANAGEMENT LAW- 2022

Objective to reduce organic material in the landfill by 75% by 2030. Requires diversion of organic materials away from landfill disposal and towards food rescue programs and organics management facilities.


HB 2301- AMENDS AND ADDS TO ORGANICS MANAGMENT LAW- 2024

Reducing Waste at the Farmers Markets



Recycling must be clean and dry, compost includes only approved packaging and utensils, and garbage is anything that is not recyclable or compostable. If you're not sure which bin something belongs in, please ask our Market Staff, and they would be more than happy to assist you.



Sort Your Waste at the Compost, Recycling, and Trash Bins

This is one of the easiest ways to have the biggest impact on waste in the markets. If you do find yourself with trash, compost, or recycling to dispose of at the markets, make sure you are placing it in the correct bins. If the bins are not properly sorted, then the contents become compromised, and we must throw everything in the trash.


