- Anticipate the future.




What we do

increases the availability of healthy, locally-grown foods for all Washingtonians



WSDA Regional Markets Grants

Local Food System Infrastructure Grant

- Supports local food supply chains and market access for farms, ranches, food processors, and food distributors
- Projects that expand and strengthen collaboration across linkages in the regional food supply chain
- Planning, equipment, and facilities for *post-harvest* handling, aggregation, processing, manufacturing, storing, distribution, and sale of Washington grown, caught, and raised foods





Farm to School Purchasing Grant

• WSDA Farm to School Purchasing Grants support child nutrition programs with funds to purchase foods grown, raised, caught, or foraged in Washington State



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
Produce Safety Program


