

A Farmers Market is a market place designed to bring the consumer face to face with the producer of egricultural products. The consumer can find:

& Fresh locally grown fruits and vegetibles

& Bedding plants, house plants, flowers and herbs

& Honey, eggs, neats and cheeses

Quality handicrafts propared foods and entertainment



Why Shop at a Farmers <u>Market?</u>

For a wide variety of reasons including:

A Freshness of in-season produce

Availability of bulk amounts

Keasonable prices for quality foods

& Convenience of shopping in one central location

Fun, cutdoor atmosphere ---- talk to farmers, share recipes and ideas

Where are Farmers Markets?

Everywhere! Both small towns and urban areas are seeing a growth in both the number and size of markets. Consumers find fresh, high quality, chemical-free foods. Producers find local distribution brings efficient marketing opportunities.



What is the Washington State Farmers Market Association?

WSFMA is a network of Farmers Markets across the state. It was created in 1078 as a nonprofit organization funded by member markets. It works with other agricultural groups and government agencies to provide workshops and marketing resources.





- Year Round
- Apply with DOH
- Distribute currency at the market info booth
- Reimburse vendors
- Connect with SMM Technical Assistants for reporting & invoicing support



- Accepts currency for eligible items
- Reimburse through market
- NO change given





- Shoppers do not need to sign up
- Go to market booth to receive incentives after running their EBT card
- Up to \$25 per day
- Spend on eligible items
- Currency expires on 12/31

WIC and Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program

TTTS **Farmers Markets**

- June 1 Oct. 31
- Markets must apply every 3 years with DOH (2024-2026)
- Support both growers and shoppers during market season
- Ensure growers have signage posted



- June 1 Oct. 31
- Growers must apply every 2 years with DOH (2023-2024)
- Must sign up to use WIC Direct Vendor
 Portal to take
 payments using QR
 code
- Exact dollar amount to be charged



- June 1 Oct. 31
- WIC and Seniors must sign up every year
- WIC FMNP = \$30 per qualifying family member per month, up to \$90 per season
- Senior FMNP qualifying shoppers receive \$80 per season.

- Minimum of \$26 a month (use it or lose it per month)
