

2024 WIC "Fruit & Vegetable Benefits"



The WIC and Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program (FMNP) season is June 1 to October 31. New in 2023, WIC shoppers are able to use another benefit that they have called WIC "Fruit & Vegetable Benefits" (also called "Cash Value Benefits"). The WIC "Fruit & Vegetable Benefits" can be used year-round at farmers markets using the same QR code and PIN.

What's the Difference between WIC FMNP and WIC Fruit and Vegetable Benefits?

	WIC Farmers Market Nutrition Program (FMNP)	WIC Fruit & Vegetable Benefits
Growers' Booth Signs	This is the sign Growers are required to post at their booth from June 1 to Oct 31. This sign is for both the WIC & the Senior FMNP. Seniors are able to buy honey and get \$80 per season.	This sign is new and available from the Dept of Health. Should be posted booth from November 1 to May 31, and June 1 to Oct 31 if space allows.
When benefits can be used?	June 1 to October 31	All year! However, benefits do expire each month.
Where can benefits be used?	With growers that are authorized by FMNP and selling at Farmers Markets and Farm Stands that are authorized to accept FMNP by the Dept of Health.	Grocery stores and, for the first time in 2023, with growers that are authorized by FMNP at authorized Farmers Markets
What can people buy?	Fresh fruits, vegetables, and cut herbs.	Same as WIC FMNP. Fresh fruits, vegetables, and cut herbs.
How much are benefits?	\$30 per farmers market season for up to 3 people per family or \$90 (June 1 to Oct 31).	\$26 and up per month, depending on family. In FFY2024, per month, families may receive \$26.00 for children (1-5 years old); \$47.00 for pregnant and postpartum participants; \$52.00 for breastfeeding participants; \$78 for pregnant and breastfeeding with multiples (twins, etc.).
How much was redeemed in WA in 2023?	WIC FMNP = \$446,966	WIC Fruits and Vegetables = \$47,312 at farmers markets and over \$29 million statewide in FFY2023
Who gets these benefits?	Women who are participating in the Women, Infants, Children (WIC) program and request to receive FMNP. Only ~30% of all WIC participants receive FMNP. WiC participants with WIC FMNP also get the Fruit and Vegetable Benefits.	All women who are participating in the Women, Infants, Children (WIC) program. In FFY2023, there were 56,860 women in Washington participating in WIC. 147,166 infants and children also benefited.
How do people redeem WIC benefits at a farmers market booth?	By using a QR code and PIN. The QR code was introduced in 2023 and replaced the paper \$4.00 checks. The QR code may be on the WICShopper app, on the eWIC card, printed out, or on a screenshot.	By using a QR code and PIN. The QR code may be on the WICShopper app or the eWIC card.
How do growers get their money?	Money from WIC FMNP sales is deposited into the Growers bank account once a week.	Money from WIC Fruit and Vegetable Benefits is deposited into the Growers bank account once a week.


What does WIC FMNP and WIC Fruit and Vegetable Benefits look like?

To growers at farmers markets, they look exactly the same. To WIC participants, their QR code may be on a physical card, piece of paper, photo, or on a smart device using the WICShopper app.


The WICShopper App

There are currently around 135 farmers markets authorized to accept FMNP.
